- Article 1 The Taipei Medical University Guidelines for Integrated Project Grants (hereinafter referred to as "the Guidelines") were formulated by the Taipei Medical University (TMU) to improve the capacity of full-time teachers to participate in integrated research projects granted by government agencies and the National Health Research Institution (NHRI) and to further enhance the research output and academic status of TMU.
- Article 2 Full-time TMU teachers listed as the principal investigator of the main project under integrated research projects granted by government agencies and the NHRI may apply for a grant of a maximum of 30% of the original approved amount for each subproject implemented at TMU. The grant for each integrated research project shall not exceed NT\$2 million.
- Article 3 Application method: Submit the application form with the original application proposal and relevant proof documents attached to the TMU Office of Research and Development.

Article 4 Project review:

The preliminary review is conducted by a review committee of five to seven members appointed by the president of TMU, and a final review is conducted by the research and development committee. The review focuses are as follows:

- 1. the research performance and project management abilities of the principal investigator,
- 2. the significance and innovativeness of the project,

- 3. the feasibility of the research content and methods,
- 4. the deliverables and expected results,
- 5. the feasibility of the funds and personnel required, and
- 6. replies to comments provided in the preliminary review.

Article 5 The Guidelines and amendments thereto shall be promulgated and take effect after approval at an administrative meeting.
